Grade Level News- What is going on in our school's classrooms! Grade 2

In Room 201 we have been busy in science. Each team adopted a tree for the year and each team is monitoring changes throughout the year. We are collecting air temperature data using the Carnevale Weather Station to monitor seasonal temperature and tree growth. We are also studying plant ecosystems and their needs and have planted seeds in different conditions to see whether they can grow and thrive.

In math the students are learning about measurement using different tools to measure objects, estimating the lengths of objects using inches, feet, centimeters and meters, also the students are learning how to use addition and subtraction to solve measurement problems.

Integrated Pre-K

We have been very busy in Pre-K. Students have been spending time building positive relationships with other children. They are learning how to take turns and share materials. We begin our day with a routine of hand washing and morning jobs. Children put their belongings away in their cubbies, wash their hands and do their morning jobs, which include, sign- in and answering the guestion of the day. Students either trace or sign their names on a daily sign in sheet. The question of the day relates to the topic of the unit we are studying. Next is our daily meeting. We review the letter of the week, shape and number. We sing a song at every meeting. We also wish our absent friends well. This is part of the conscious discipline classroom. Students are learning self regulation skills and about being part of a classroom family. We have started to dig into the Tree Unit of the Creative Curriculum. Our library is filled with books about trees. We went on a hunt outside to find parts of trees. We are examining the parts closely in our science center using magnifying glasses. Our little artists have been creative at the art center. We made apples out of red tissue paper and stamped fingerprints on tree pictures to represent leaves. Every day we learn something new in Pre-K. We explore through free play at centers, interact in small groups and whole group instruction and sometimes we work one on one with the classroom teacher.

Grade 2

This is what's happening in 207 and 205:

In terms of reading skills we use ARC, they are introduced to basic grammar skills and different types of writing. The focus on developing reading skills lays emphasis on reading for better comprehension.

The subject of Science helps them explore basic Life Science like plants and habitats, Earth sciences like processes that shape the earth. We will look at Physical Science like properties of Matter. In our ARC Reading Units we also cover Bugs, Animals and communities.

In Math, they are introduced to larger numbers (building up on what was taught to them in the first grade) and fundamental operations such as addition and subtraction. They are also taught measurement of time, length, distance, weight and temperature along with additional basic concepts of geometry.

*Looking through the backpack each night and listening to your child read is very important.

Grades 3-5 Exceptional Child Services (E.C.S.)

In the month of October we have been working on studying animals. This has included learning about different kinds of animals, as well as which kinds of habitats those animals can be found in. We have been reading stories about characters who take trips to places where animals can be seen, such as zoos, and we have been answering questions about those stories. In math, we have been completing patterns using images of the animals that we have been learning about, and we have also been counting those animals as well.

Grade 5

Reading:

We are having fun reading two core books by the same author, Bruce Coville. One is fiction, **Amazing Aliens** and the other is nonfiction **My Teacher's an Alien**. We are learning to summarize both types of texts. We are also building our vocabulary by using context clues to define unknown words. Our students are also practicing determining the theme of a story.

Writing: Students in our class wrote a 5 paragraph essay. We are also creating various fictional alien stories.

Math:We are learning how to read, write, and say numbers into the thousandths to better understand place value. We are also comparing, ordering, adding, subtracting and multiplying decimals.

Science: Students are ready to support an argument that the gravitational force exerted by Earth on objects is directed down . We learned that the apparent brightness of the sun compared to other stars is due to the relative distances from the Earth. Students are measuring their shadows at different times of the day and different seasons to observe patterns.
