#### Notes from Nurse – Mrs. Anderson RN: HAPPY FALL

With colder weather more illnesses occur. It is important that parents or an emergency contact can be reached if your child should become sick. Please make sure all emergency phone numbers are up to date. Please send any changes to school immediately.

#### **WHEN TO STAY HOME**

While attendance at school is important to your child's success, there are certain times that your child should stay home. They are as follows:

-An increase in symptoms of coughing, sneezing or runny nose (especially if nasal drainage changes color from clear to yellowish-green).

-Any fever, (before returning to school, children must be free of fever for 24 hours without the use of any fever reducing medicines, such as Tylenol or Motrin.

-Vomiting and/or diarrhea, your child should be tolerating their regular diet, before returning to school.

You know your child best of all. Please use your own judgment if you feel your child should stay home even when they want to come to school. Please don't hesitate to call me for any questions!
