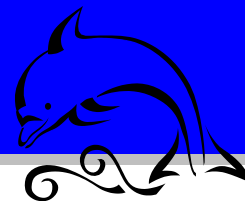

Physical Education/ Health News

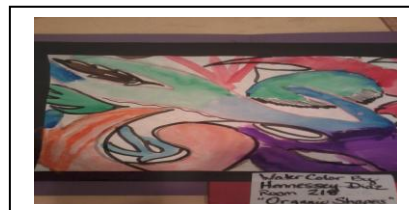
