








DISTRICT UPDATES

Through guided programming, SESLA equips young leaders with the tools and knowledge necessary to create impactful change in their communities. This Academy will take place from August 13, 2024 through August 23, 2024 at the Watson Institute for International and Public Affairs at Brown University. It is open to up to 40 RESPECT students. Permission slips have been distributed to schools and will be accepted on a first come basis. The Academy is free and transportation will be provided.
